Recommend delete from Health & Safety Code Section 44003(a)(2) as the report was completed and submitted to recipients in April 2004.	This was a one-time report that was completed.
2	Beginning no later than January 1, 2012, the department shall provide all licensed smog check stations & technicians, if technicians are included pursuant to subdivision (b), a preliminary report on the station's & technician's performance applying performance standards. The preliminary report shall include criteria that is the basis of the performance standards & an assessment of the station's & technician's potential eligibility to issue certificates of compliance or noncompliance for vehicles selected or vehicles identified by the department as gross polluters	Delete reporting requirement. Recommend delete from Health & Safety Code Section 44014.6(c) as the report was completed and submitted to recipients on December 29, 2011.	This report was completed and submitted to recipients prior to Jan. 1, 2012.
3	The department, in cooperation with the state board, shall investigate new technologies including the role of onboard diagnostic systems in vehicles, as a means both for detecting excess emissions and defective emission control equipment, and for assisting in determining what repairs would be effective	Delete reporting requirement. Recommended delete from Health & Safety Code Section 44024(e) as the recipient sunset on December 31, 2011 (Inspection & Maintenance Review Committee). Last report completed and submitted to recipient on December 7, 2011.	The Inspection and Maintenance Review Committee is no longer in existence. The last report was completed and delivered to the Committee in 2011.
4	Report of Errors in "Loss Leader" Notification	Delete reporting requirement. Recommend delete <u>after</u> completion of the November 1, 2012 report - report no longer will be required.	The Legislature may wish to consider deleting this report requirement only after the final report of 2012.
5	Any contract entered into pursuant to this section shall not be subject to any restrictions that are applicable to contracts in the Government Code or in the Public Contract Code. The department shall report to the Legislature any action that is taken in accordance with this subdivision.	Delete reporting requirement. Recommend delete from Health & Safety Code Section 44081.6(e) as the report was completed and submitted to recipient in March 1995.
