DGS recommends this report be deleted from the Legislative Counsel list as the sale of the Orange County Fairgrounds did not proceed.	Although the sale of the Orange County Fairgrounds did not occur, the Legislature may wish to consider retaining the reporting requirements for any future authorized sale.

As we enter 2012, the CAP's planned housing, office, and retail development is nearing completion. In recent years, the level of development activity has diminished significantly to the point that progress in the Capitol Area has not appreciably changed on a year-by-year basis to continue preparing, tracking, and filing this formal report.</p> <p>As the State Agency responsible for jurisdiction of the State-owned properties in the Capitol Area, DGS' RESD Asset Management Branch will continue to coordinate with the Capitol Area Development Authority, the Capitol Area Committee and the Technical Advisory Committee to oversee the progress made in realizing the development goals set forth in the 1997 Capitol Area Plan update.</p>	According to the Department of General Services, the level of development activity has diminished to the point that tracking this information annually would not reveal any appreciable changes.

DGS recommends this report be deleted from the Legislative Counsel list as the work associated with this Bond Act has been completed and the funds depleted.	The work associated with the Public Buildings Rehabilitation Bond Act of 1990 is completed and the funds are expended.
6	Report on the energy savings, in terms of megawatts, realized in public buildings through retrofits to reduce energy consumption, improve energy efficiency, or generate electricity using renewable fuels	Delete reporting requirement. DGS recommends this report be deleted from the Legislative Counsel list as this bill is already slated for elimination through AB 1431, which was passed unanimously by committee on January 19, 2012.	The Assembly has approved the deletion of this report in legislation that was held in the Senate pending this greater report elimination effort.
7	Report on the demonstration project to study the use of Integrated Pest Management techniques at the State Capitol Park and its associated grounds	Delete reporting requirement. DGS recommends this report be deleted from the Legislative Counsel list because this was a one-time report and the requirement has been satisfied.	This one-time report was completed and submitted to the Legislature.
8	Regarding Richmond Laboratory and office facility, specification of terms of proposed agreement, how acquisition, construction, or remodeling will meet State Department of Health Services' needs for laboratory facilities in East Bay Area, and implementation plans for Richmond facility	Delete reporting requirement. DGS recommends this report be deleted from the Legislative Counsel list as the report was a one-time report and was completed and submitted as required.	This one-time report was completed and submitted to the Legislature.

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9	Report on contractors' complaints received (progress payments). Requires all State agencies, including DGS, to report on the number and dollar volume of written complaints of progress payment violations received from subcontractors and prime contractors on contracts in excess of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000)	Delete reporting requirement. DGS recommends this report be deleted from the Legislative Counsel list as the information is not of much value. Since the implementation of Public Contract Code Section 10262.5, there have been substantial gains in the electronic record keeping of payments by the State to contractors. Over 80 percent of complaints received at DGS are resolved within the reporting year of the stop notice submittal. The report becomes insignificant at the time of submittal to the Legislature as most all outstanding payments are already resolved. Presumably there would be even less need for stop notice action, eliminating available data for a report, if subcontractors were more familiar with the readily available information on the progress payments website. The Legislature may wish to consider deleting the reporting requirement but requiring DGS to post formal complaints on their website. The Speaker's office has requests this report be retained.
10	State Motor Vehicle Fleet	Delete reporting requirement. Per DGS' Office of Fleet and Asset Management Division: This information posts to the website so a report to the Legislature is redundant.	The Legislature may wish to consider amending the reporting requirement to require the Department to gather and report the information on its website.
11	CA Action Plan for Reducing or Displacing the Consumption of Petroleum Products by the State Fleet	Delete reporting requirement. Per DGS' Office of Fleet and Asset Management Division: This information posts to the website so a report to the Legislature is redundant.	The Legislature may wish to consider amending the reporting requirement to require DGS to gather and report the information on its website until 2020.
12	Report Explaining reasons for delay in adoption of regulations to administer the Lery F. Greene School Facilities Act	Delete reporting requirement. This report was a conditional one time requirement, so there is no ongoing requirement.	This report was a conditional, one-time report.
13	State Government Records	Delete reporting requirement. No longer needed. We use a standardized measurement for calculating rather than annual record inventory, so no need for this report.	This report requirement for State Government Records is based upon practices that have been replaced by standardized measurement calculations.

These reports are provided to the State Allocation Board by school districts and regional occupational centers. The Office of Public School Construction recommends these reporting requirements be eliminated. These reports are provided to the State Allocation Board by school districts and regional occupational centers. The Office of Public School Construction recommends these reporting requirements be eliminated.	According to the Department of General Services, these reports are provided to the State Allocation Board (membership comprised of a majority of Legislators) by school districts and regional occupation centers.
<b>17</b>	Multitrack Year Round School Report	Delete reporting requirement. DGS' OPSC recommends this report be eliminated as multi track education is being phased out.	According to the Department of General Services, multi-track education is being phased-out.
