1	Intervener Award Reports: Report on results of intervener award program	This reporting requirement should be deleted as the CA Energy Commission no longer offers intervener awards. (The last report on intervener awards was received by Leg Counsel on 3/18/1991.)	The Energy Commission no longer offers the intervener award program.
2	AB 970 Report: An expenditure plan that specifies those agencies and positions for which funds will be expended pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 8 of Chapter 329 of the Statutes of 2000 for implementation of the California Energy Security and Reliability Act of 2000	Delete Reporting Requirement. This report was a one time report tied to the expenditure of CA Energy Commission funds	This was a one-time expenditure plan due to the Governor and Legislature and completed prior to expending the funds provided in this section.
3	Peak Load Reduction Annual Report: Cost effectiveness criteria for programs funded in order to achieve a total reduction in peak electricity demand and to meet the needs of low-income households	This reporting requirement should be removed as it was put in place during the 2000 electricity crisis and is no longer necessary.	This one-time reporting requirement required the Energy Commission to submit cost-effectiveness criteria for programs funded by this section during the 2000 electricity challenge.
4	Proposed schedule for adopting performance standards and labeling requirements for landscape irrigation emission devices and valves	Delete reporting requirement. The statutory language made it discretionary. The CA Energy Commission did conduct a preliminary public proceeding to consider the potential for adopting standards. That proceeding concluded that there was insufficient technical data and analyses necessary to substantiate specific standards or labeling requirements for the landscape irrigation equipment. The proceeding was discontinued because of a lack of resources to address the lack of technical data. No report was made to the Legislature because of this lack of funds.	The requirement for the Energy Commission to adopt performance standards and labeling requirements for landscape irrigation equipment was discretionary and contingent upon adequate resources. The report, due in 2010 was never completed because the Energy Commission did not adopt standards and labeling requirements.
5	Summary of publicly owned utility efforts to comply with Public Utilities Code sec. 9500 & 9501 regarding low income weatherization services	This requirement should be deleted because it is duplicative. The CA Energy Commission subsumes reporting on these programs within the Integrated Energy Policy Report.	The information in this report is available in the Energy Commission's Integrated Energy Policy Report.
