1	Proposition 84 - Report on Funds	Delete reporting requirement. One time report in response to SBX2 1 that was due within 2 years of receiving funding. Reporting requirement complete 3/17/2010.	According to the Department of Public Health, this one-time requirement was from Proposition 84 and was completed in 2010.
2	Evaluation of Over-the-Counter Sterile Syringes - effects of allowing pharmacists to furnish or sell a limited number of hypodermic needles without a prescription	Remove reporting requirement from LCB website. Reporting requirement complete July 19, 2010. Report still shows as being due on Legislative Counsel's website.	This one-time report was completed and submitted.
3	Small Water System Fees - synopsis of key issues regarding the state's responsibilities and oversight of small water systems, sustainability to meet drinking water standards	Remove reporting requirement from LCB website. This one-time reporting requirement was completed September 11, 2009.	This one-time report was completed and submitted.
4	AIDS Drug Assistance Program Drug Formulary Changes - summary of any changes to the AIDS Drug Assistance Program list of drugs to be provided under the program	Delete reporting requirement. Notification is only required if DPH makes any changes to the drug formulary list and this information is already provided through the budget process in the AIDS Drug Assistance Program estimate.	According to the Department of Public Health, information and estimates on the AIDS Drug Assistance Program is provided through annual budget process.
5	AIDS Early Intervention - assessment of effectiveness of different models of early intervention projects from collection of data	Delete reporting requirement. This program was eliminated and no longer exists within the department.	According to the Department of Public Health, this program no longer exists within the department.
6	American Indians Statistics - results of study that established valid statistics regarding death rate for American Indians after program is funded	Delete reporting requirement. Reports were due in 1994 and 1998. No further requests have been made for these reports.	According to the Department of Public Health, reports were due in 1994 and 1998 on the Death Rate for American Indians. The Legislature may wish to ask the Department if this program was ever funded and if the reports were ever completed.
7	Asbestos in Public Schools - report on air monitoring standards for asbestos in public schools	Delete reporting requirement. Department of Toxic Substances Control is lead on this and the last report/guidance document was produced in 2004.	According to the Department of Public Health, the last report was completed in 2004 and the Department of Toxic Substances Control is lead on this issue. The Legislature may wish to consider in the future looking at the reporting requirements of the Department of Toxic Substance Control under the recently adopted government re-organization.
8	Bottled and Vender Water - summary of bottled and vended water program licensees and inspection related activities	Delete reporting requirement. This information can easily be placed on the department's website.	The Legislature may wish to require the Department of Public Health to include this information on their website.

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9	Cervical Cancer Community Awareness Campaign - progress report	Delete reporting requirement. The program has never been funded, and therefore never implemented.	The Cervical Cancer Awareness Campaign was conditioned on receiving voluntary contributions. This provision already allows for the conditional repeal of the program in 2007 if the Department of Finance determines insufficient funding to run the program.
10	Federal Definition of Medical Food - changes to the federal definition of "medical food" and recommend if California should incorporate this change	Delete reporting requirement. Changes are federally required and are already disseminated.	According to the Department of Public Health, changes to the federal definition of "Medical Food" are already disseminated. The Legislature may wish to consider retaining this requirement which also requires a recommendation on whether California should make the same change.
11	Health Risk Assessments - recommendations on staffing requirements for review of health risk assessments	Delete reporting requirement. The reporting requirement is permissive and due only if the department is required to evaluate staffing requirements for any deemed high priority facilities.	The Legislature may wish to retain this reporting requirement as it is due only if the department is required to evaluate staffing requirements for high priority facilities.
12	Healthy Food Purchase Pilot - recommendations regarding the continuation of the pilot and any state or federal policy changes needed to support the program	Delete reporting requirement. No funds have ever been appropriated to the pilot project.	According to the Department of Public Health, funding has never been provided to the Healthy Food Purchase Pilot program, which may have already been repealed.
13	HIV Reporting System - report on whether California's HIV reporting does or does not meet federal standards and criteria under the Ryan White Comprehensive AIDS Resources Emergency (CARE) Act of 1990	Delete reporting requirement. Report that was due prior to the DHCS/DPH split. No record of the report being submitted or requested.	According to the Department of Public Health, there is no record of this report, due in 2005. This requirement pre-dated the split of the Department of Health Care Services and the Department of Public Health.
14	Immunization Information System - sustainability plan for full funding of statewide immunization information system that integrates existing immunization systems throughout the state	Delete reporting requirement. Then Dept. of Health Services planned to secure funds from the First Five, but this appropriation never occurred and the system was never developed. DPH is implementing CalREDIE instead.	According to the Department of Public Health, this program was not funded or implemented. In the future, the Legislature may wish to consider reporting requirements on the alternative information system currently being implemented.

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<b>15</b>	Infant Formula Federal Changes - federal changes in the definition of "infant formula" and recommend whether California should incorporate those changes.	Delete reporting requirement. These changes are federally required and are already reported to the legislature and stakeholders as they occur.	According to the Department of Public Health, federal changes to the definition of "infant formula" are already reported to the Legislature and public as they occur. The Legislature may wish to consider requiring DPH to provide this information on their website.
<b>16</b>	Lead in Tableware Report (concerning number and findings of inspections performed and samples taken to determine compliance with lead in tableware)	Delete reporting requirement. This report is due upon request of the legislature, and a report has not been requested or submitted for over 10 years.	This report on compliance with laws governing lead in tableware is upon the request of the Legislature. According to the Department of Public health, this report has not been requested or submitted for 10 years. The Legislature may wish to consider retaining this option in statute.
<b>17</b>	Nurse Family Partnership Program (results of evaluation of the voluntary nurse home visiting program for first time mothers, children and families)	Delete reporting requirement. Program is funded by voluntary dollars. It would cost approx. \$2 million to implement and sufficient contributions have not been collected to begin implementation.	According to the Department of Public Health, sufficient voluntary contributions have not been collected to implement the Nurse Family Partnership program.
<b>18</b>	Pool and Spa Safety (requires DHS to make recommendations whether to adopt a state standard after the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) adopts federal standards for entrapment hazards in pools and spas)	Delete reporting requirement. This report is only due if the CPSC adopts a federal standard and if the department believes a state standard needs to be adopted.	The Legislature may wish to retain this reporting requirement which not only notifies lawmakers on federal standards, but also makes recommendations for modifications to state law.
<b>19</b>	Prostate Cancer Screening Program (progress report on activities and effectiveness of the program)	Delete reporting requirement. This program administered through a contract with UCLA and has had a constant caseload since inception. Information can be provided upon request.	According to the Department of Public Health, this program contracted out to UCLA and information is available upon request. The Legislature may wish to consider retaining this annual requirement.
<b>20</b>	Public Health School Center Support (progress report on the implementation of school health centers and programs within DMH and ADP)	Delete reporting requirement. Funding has been eliminated and thus nothing new to report on implementation.	According to the Department of Public Health, funding for this program has been eliminated.
<b>21</b>	Radioactive Waste (annual summary of information reported)	Delete reporting requirement. Program has never received a request from a Legislator for this information.	This information on radioactive waste is required to be provided to the Legislature upon request. The Legislature may wish to retain this option in statute.

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22	School Lead Sample Survey	Remove reporting requirement from LCB website. Reporting requirement has been met.	This information on the School Lead Sample Survey is required to be provided to the Legislature upon request. The Legislature may wish to retain this option in statute.
23	Teen Pregnancy Community Challenge Grant (evaluation of the completion of each grant cycle)	Delete reporting requirement. Program was eliminated in July 2010.	According to the Department of Public Health, this program was eliminated in July, 2010.
24	Vital Records Improvement Project (VRIP) (progress report on the vital records improvement project)	Delete the reporting requirement. VRIP is on track and no information has been requested. Additionally, the statute is silent as to which entity the report should be provided.	If the Legislature this annual report to continue, they may wish to consider adding a provision guiding to whom the report should be provided. According to the Department of Public health, no information on the progress of the Vital Records Improvement Project has ever been requested.
25	Blood Products (blood banks requiring blood platelets from paid donors from 1996-2002)	Delete reporting requirement. Reporting requirement expired in 2002.	According to the Department of Public Health, the reporting requirement only involved blood banks requiring blood platelets from paid donors from 1994-2002.
